#### **BRING YOUR OWN DEVICE IN 2024**

We are pleased to announce that we will expand our school laptop program to all of Year 7 in 2024. Our aim is for all Year 7 students to have 24 x 7 access to a laptop computer so that they can benefit from the rich learning resources available online and develop the skills required for the 21st Century. All of our neighbouring schools have moved to laptop programs as they have also recognised the increased opportunities for learning that are offered.

There are two options for families in relation to this. The preferred option is for students to Bring Your Own Device (BYOD). This involves families purchasing a device from a retailer and has the advantage that the family then owns the device into the future.

The second option is to rent a device from the school. We will have a small number of laptops available for this purpose. In 2024, the yearly rental fee will be \$250. Families can pay the rental up front or organise payment plans by contacting our Business Manager at the school. The school retains ownership of the rental device and families simply hand it back at the end of each year. Any damage to the device will be charged to the student's account.

BYOD in Year 7 is a logical extension of our existing laptop programs that have been in place and operating very successfully in the Senior School and in Excellence Programs for a number of years.

Our year 10 students participated in the Gateways in Schools - Women Who Weld program this term with great enthusiasm.

This years program marks the fourth of its kind to be hosted at Glenala SHS. The success of this program has been through the commitment from Mr Dhirendra Singh, Senior Engineering Teacher and Mrs Sharina Gibney, Head of Department Senior Schooling.

In the first session, students used augmented reality welders under the guidance of Adam Coorey from Weld Australia. Later in the afternoon students practiced real welding with support from The Drake Group trades women Erin and fourth year apprentice Sam.

GM Poles Australia fabricator James and third year apprentice Peter, also played a crucial part in supporting students to learn and navigate real welding skills and build their jewellery tree.

The aim of this event is to encourage young women explore careers in the manufacturing sector or trade pathway as over 80 % of jobs within Qld's manufacturing sector is still occupied by men.

The purpose of the Women Who Weld program is:

- To promote Engineering subject in years 11 and 12.
- To encourage visible gender equality in the workplace.
- To broaden the horizons of young people to the advancing manufacturing and engineering industry opportunities.
- $\bullet$  To strengthen & encourage self-esteem in girls.
- $\bullet$  To produce skilled & confident welders who are women.
- To support young women to build relationships with their local communities.

The highlight of the day involved our school Principal, Michelle Snell donning the welding jacket, gloves and helmet to have a practice her welding skills in the welding booth.

# **School Student Broadband Initiative**



#### School Student Broadband Initiative - Australian Government

To boost educational opportunities and narrow the digital divide, families without home internet are encouraged to apply for the <u>School Student Broadband Initiative</u> (SSBI). Access to internet a thome can support children to build their digital skills and participate in a world that is more reliant on digital technology.

The Australian Government is supporting the National Broadband Network (NBN) to implement the SSBI to provide free home internet for one year for up to 30,000 unconnected families across Australia with school aged students.

#### To be eligible for SSBI, a family must:

- . Have a child living at home that is enrolled in a Queensland state school in 2023.
- Not have an active internet service at home. Having a mobile internet service does not affect eligibility.
- Be referred by a nominating organisation.
- Agree their child has access to a device and has the digital skills to use the <u>internet</u> safely or will be supervised.
- Live in a premises that can access the NBN via a standard connection this will be checked by NBN.

#### How can you be nominated for the SSBI?

The Department of Education and The Smith family are both nominating organisations for the SSBI.

#### PHYSICS EXCURSION

This term Mr Warren and Ms Edgerton took the senior Year 11 and 12 physics classes to the Nuclear Medicine department at the Royal Brisbane Women's Hospital to speak with Dr Jye Smith – Principal Medical Physicist – and Dr Matthew Griffiths – Medical Physicist – to learn about how nuclear physics is used to treat health conditions in Brisbane.

They got to observe both a PET Scan and Gamma Camera and discussed the theory behind both and the different methods they use to diagnose medical issues. They also went down behind the very thick door to the cyclotron to observe where radioactive fluorine is produced for use across the entire state.

Students will use this experience as part of their research and planning for their final year 12 physics paper in their exploration of how nuclear physics is utilised to benefit us all.- Mr Adam Warren- Senior Science Teacher
